3. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION:

Extremely flammable. Harmful by inhalation. Irritating to eyes. Repeated exposure may cause skin dryness or cracking.

4. FIRST AID MEASURES:

INHALATION: NOTE! Keep affected person away from heat, sparks and flames! Move the exposed person to fresh air at once. When breathing is difficult, properly trained personnel may assist affected person by administering 100% oxygen. Keep the affected person warm and at rest. Get prompt medical attention.

INGESTION: Not relevant.

SKIN: Wash the skin immediately with soap and water. Get medical attention if any discomfort continues.

EYES: Spray in the eyes: Make sure to remove any contact lenses from the eyes before rinsing. Promptly wash eyes with plenty of water while lifting the eye lids. Continue to rinse for at least 15 minutes. Get medical attention if any discomfort continues.

5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES:

EXTINGUISHING MEDIA: Use: Powder. Dry chemicals, sand, dolomite etc. Water spray, fog or mist.

SPECIAL FIRE FIGHTING PROCEDURES: Containers close to fire should be removed or cooled with water. Use water to keep fire exposed containers cool and disperse vapours.

UNUSUAL FIRE & EXPLOSION HAZARDS: Aerosol cans may explode in fires. Risk of explosion if heated.

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES:

SPILL CLEANUP METHODS: Wear necessary protective equipment. Extinguish all ignition sources. Avoid sparks, flames, heat and smoking. Ventilate. In handling of spillage, please also consult the section detailing protective measures.

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE:

USAGE PRECAUTIONS: Keep away from heat, sparks and open flame. Avoid spilling, skin and eye contact. Ventilate well, avoid breathing vapours. Use approved respirator if air contamination is above accepted level.

STORAGE PRECAUTIONS: Aerosol cans: Must not be exposed for direct sunlight or temperatures above 50°C.
